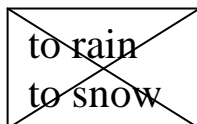

Imperative sentences in the main clause.

Please phone when they come.
 Don't tell him about the incident when he asks.
 Don't get frightened when he is displeased.
 Make the children go to bed when they are tired.
 Put on a raincoat when it rains (starts raining).
 Don't go swimming when it is too stormy.

Clauses of Condition (Conditional Clauses)

Positive condition.

If she fails the exam, she will be disappointed.

6. Make her put on a warm sweater if it is chilly.
